Inox to build two wind farms for Tata Power arm

Deal is worth ₹1,032 crore

Inox Wind, a subsidiary of Gujarat Fluorochemicals, said it has been awarded two wind-farm project contracts of 54 MW and 118 MW in Gujarat and Rajasthan by Tata Power Renewable Energy Ltd (TPREL).

The deal is said to be about ₹1,032 crore.

TPREL is a wholly-owned subsidiary of Tata Power.

Inox will supply, erect and commission 86 units of its two MW wind turbine generators.

The Gujarat project, near Rojmal village of Bhavnagar district, will be completed by June while the Rajasthan project, which is close to Dangri village of Jaisalmer district, by March 2016. Inox is responsible for site acquisition to commissioning, Inox will supply, erect and commission 86 units of its two MW wind turbine generators.
